

Fiscal Year 2024 Community Benefits Plan Report Summary

Shirley Ryan AbilityLab, formerly known as the Rehabilitation Institute of Chicago ("RIC"), is the global leader in physical medicine and rehabilitation for adults and children with the most severe, complex conditions — from traumatic brain and spinal cord injury to stroke, amputation and cancer-related impairment. Shirley Ryan AbilityLab is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation, as defined by the Internal Revenue Code. It expands and accelerates leadership in the field — leadership that began at RIC in 1953. The quality of its care has led to its designation as the number-one rehabilitation hospital in America by U.S. News & World Report every year since 1991. No other hospital, of any kind, has held this distinction for as many consecutive years. Shirley Ryan AbilityLab provides a continuum of care, offering inpatient, outpatient, and day rehabilitation ("DayRehab®") services.

In fiscal year ("FY") 2024, Shirley Ryan AbilityLab treated 3,785 inpatients and 18,401 outpatients and DayRehab[®] patients. Shirley Ryan AbilityLab facilities are staffed by approximately 2,617 clinicians, scientists, researchers, administrators, and support personnel — an integrated and dedicated team, which last year treated patients from nearly every state in the nation, as well as from multiple countries around the world.

Charity Care, Community Benefits Spending, and Financial Assistance

Shirley Ryan AbilityLab offers financial assistance to qualifying Illinois residents by fully or partially waiving patient financial obligations for medically necessary services. Individuals who may qualify for financial assistance are invited to submit an application. Each application is reviewed, and decisions are made based upon objective, needs-based criteria.

Shirley Ryan AbilityLab also funds numerous community benefits for multiple underserved populations — benefits that would not exist without the organization's support. Initiatives include:

- LIFE Center education and outreach, including patient peer support groups and education for healthcare providers;
- An adaptive sports program, which is comprised of recreational and competitive sports programming for children and adults, sports and fitness center programming, and military sports programming; and
- Innovative medical research.

In the process, the organization has established a vast network that promotes care, education, healing, and community among those with functional impairments.
